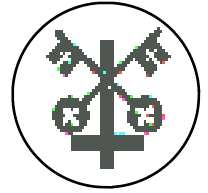

Good Neighbours

Dear Friends

Ask about the message of Jesus and many people would struggle to tell you what he said. But my guess is that one of his sayings would stand out: "Love thy neighbour as thyself."

It's an easy thing to say, but how easy is it to *do*? How many of us do actually love and support our neighbours, especially when they are in some kind of need? My hope is that from later this spring, we can offer practical care and love can be offered to our neighbours. How will this happen? Well, the churches of St Mary's and St Peter's are setting up a care scheme called **Good Neighbours**. This will offer help, to anyone in our villages who needs it. No residents will be precluded from using the scheme in times of need. However, we have in mind particularly three groups of people: the elderly, those who have serious mobility problems, and families during times of domestic emergency such as the sickness of parents. Services offered will include friendship for the elderly or lonely and transport (for example, to doctor's surgeries or hospitals) A similar scheme in Suffolk offers to change light bulbs and check smoke alarms. What we can offer will depend on the skills and willingness of our volunteers.

In due course cards will be distributed to all households in the villages explaining how to make use of the scheme and to request help or support. At the moment we are recruiting volunteers – not just from church members, but from all those who share our desire to become a loving and caring community. If you would like to know more, or offer your support, I'd be delighted to hear from you.

YOUTH WORKER FOR BOXTED & LANGHAM

A longish silence on the subject does not mean that the plans for a parish Youth Worker described by the Rector in the June 2008 issue have been lying idle. Far from it — St Mary's and St Peter's have teamed up with an international organization called "Time for God", which organizes voluntary service overseas, mostly by people in their early twenties. We are the "overseas" for the young man or woman we shall be getting as our youth worker.

The plan is that, through "Time for God", we will find a suitable person from North America or Europe to come and work alongside us. The first Youth Worker will be here for ten months from September and the particulars of possible candidates should soon be at hand. The applications will then be carefully scrutinized to find the right person for us.

The purpose of the project is to develop Christian youth work for youngsters aged from 9 to 14 in the villages and the two schools as well as the churches. This will be achieved by providing engaging, entertaining and educational activities that are both safe and relevant. The hope is that the young people involved can develop their identity and self-worth as responsible members of the community, and in their Christian faith.

The Youth Worker will be liaising with the two primary schools, whose heads are very supportive of the project, as are the two Parish Councils. He or she will help to run clubs in the villages, working with the Sunday School children and the Church youth group, SPASM, and getting involved as much as possible in church and village life.

The outcome of the project will be judged on the basis of attendance at the various activities in the first instance and then feedback from parents, schools, parish councils, residents and, most importantly, from the young people themselves.
