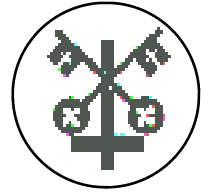

LANGHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL

DEDHAM VALE WINTER WALKS

The Deham Vale AONB & Stour Valley Project (sponsored by the County and District Councils either side of the River Stour and by English Nature) has for some years arranged guided walks in interesting parts of Dedham Vale and the adjoining areas. The walks vary from "easy" (a gentle stroll with locations accessible to everyone) to "moderate +" (for more experienced walkers covering longer distances). They are led by guides with good knowledge of the route of the walk and often involve short diversions to places of particular significance. The numbers on each walk are limited and places have to be booked in advance on 01473 264263. There is a charge of £3 for each adult (children free) to cover costs.

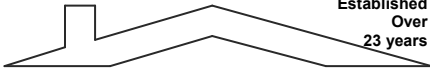
